Re: Car parks around the GLTT campus and carpooling

The GLTT campus in Rode has two large car parks. However, if you arrive a little late you might not be able to find a parking space. In that case you can easily park your car behind the local church on one of the three car parks.

May we ask you not to cause any inconvenience to the neighbours and to park your car correctly?

The car parks around the GLTT building are public car parks where police regulations are enforced.

In order to reach the GLTT buildings in case of emergency, the fire brigade insists that the entrance to the car parks is always kept free.

GLTT also welcomes disabled students. The parking places for these students are only meant for bearers of an official parking card for the disabled. This parking card is strictly personal and can only be used if the bearer of the card is either transported by the parked vehicle or if he/she is the driver.

On the car park we also reserve two places for carpoolers. These spaces are only available for students with a carpool card, which can be obtained from **Brigitte Van der Beken** (carpooling@gltt.be) or by handing the completed form overleaf to the GLTT secretariat.
